



The Ride for Our Vets Rest Stop Coordinator

Contract Position, Two Available (one for each Rest Stop) | June 13, 2026

The Connecticut Veterans Legal Center (CVLC) is seeking two **Rest Stop Coordinators** to run our Rest Stops for our annual Ride for Our Vets fundraiser on June 13, 2026. These contact positions will play a critical role in the success of the event which draws between 150 – 200.

The Ride for Our Vets is a charity cycling event that raises money to support the Connecticut Veterans Legal Center's mission. This year's event will take place on Saturday, June 13th, launching and ending at Half Full Brewery in downtown Stamford.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Pick-up items from Half Full Brewery (Stamford) and take them to the rest stop
- Set-up the Rest Stop, with assistance from volunteers:
 - Set-up the pop-up tent
 - Set-up the 6-foot table
 - Set-up the water, food, and other items for Riders to pick-up
 - Set-up Rider support items in case they are needed
- Run Rest Stop, with assistance from volunteers:
 - Hand out water and food items
 - Direct Riders to restrooms as needed
- Return items to Half Full Brewery (Stamford)

REQUIRED SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE

- Valid CT driver's license with a reliable car
- Event execution / production management experience, with specific experience with running / cycling events strongly desired
- Strong attention to detail

COMPENSATION

This is a contract position paid a flat fee of \$250. *Mileage reimbursement will also be provided at the rate of 0.725/mile for all driving done in personal vehicle from Half Full Brewery to Rest Stop and back.*

Veterans, Military Spouses, and other members of the military community are strongly encouraged to apply. Studies have shown that women, members of the LGBTQ+ community, and Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) individuals are less likely to apply for jobs unless they believe they meet every single one of the qualifications as described in a job description; despite the reality that applicants rarely ever meet 100% of the qualifications.

We are committed to building a diverse and inclusive organization, and we are most interested in finding the best candidate for the role. That candidate may be one who comes from a background less traditional to our field of work, and that's okay! We strongly encourage you to apply, even if you don't believe you meet every one of the qualifications described.
